
May Program- Flash Photography by HPS Member Nathan Robbins

Struggling with flash photography, can't get the right exposure. Maybe you are used to turning everything to auto and hope for the best. Here's a chance to learn how to do it correctly. What equipment to use, how to get by on the cheap and how to pose to bring out the best. Nathan Robbins will be the presenter the next event night. He'll start with the basics, one speed light, and show how the addition of a reflector can make the photo. Then gradually build to a multi-light setup showing how additional lights and reflectors can produce professional results. Nathan will pose a model to show how minor changes in lighting angles can produce a dramatic difference. Come with your questions, come to learn.

Nathan is a web applications and data analyst by day, and a photography enthusiast by night. His love for photography began shortly after high school when he found his father's Minolta 202 gathering dust at home and started playing around with it. Since then he has had many hobbies, but he always seemed to find himself gravitating back to photography. He has always enjoyed doing landscape photography, but lately finds himself drawn to more fashion, glamour, and portraiture type of work. Nathan thinks it has something to do with the challenge of working with another person to create a meaningful image. He has been a member of HPS for approximately 3 years. The program for May 9th will be an introduction to flash photography in a studio type setting. 
HUNTSVILLE MUSEUM OF ART 2016 EXHIBIT
