


Location of HPS End of Year Banquet

Annual Parade of Lights, Dec 10, 6:00 p.m., Decatur, AL. This Christmas maritime event is sponsored by the Riverwalk Yacht Club and features many boats of all types and sizes decorated with lights, holiday themes and other festive trimmings for the holiday season. The public is invited to stroll around the docks prior to the parade, 4-6 pm, for an up close look at the brightly lit boats.
