Going quickly through the typical composition topics of patterns, leading lines, rule of thirds, etc., Scott concentrated more on "working" the photo – working the subject from various angles, from various distances; varying the white balance, ISO, aperture/depth of field, and shutter speed; and trying different lighting conditions. I really learned a lot in that one + hour. Hats off to Roger for this great idea.

Our June judge for "Broken" was Art Bond, a retired photography and art professor, and a former Dean at Alabama. Art brought an artist's perspective to judging our images and provided great comments. Something I thought unusual for the topic were two portraits, both of grizzly men on whose faces you could almost read their life histories; they were really awesome, captivating photos. Both placed, so check them out in the newsletter and on our Smug Mug site. Congratulations to all of our June winners.

We have now had several members display their photos in the VBC hallways. If you are interested in showing your photos, please contact Charles Gattis, our coordinator for this. The photos hang for a month, and Charles is looking for future participants.
