

From The President

From my letter of two years ago, consider love, hope, joy, excitement (someone got what they wanted), disappointment (someone didn't get what they wanted), frustration (those darn lights aren't working), or some other pent up emotion. Enjoy the holidays with your family and friends.

Lee Pratt and Andrea Shetley presented their annual 3-D photography program, this time with images from New Mexico. The photos were stunning; the landscape colors and shapes rendered in 3-D made you believe you were really there. One thing I found interesting that Andrea said was that the technology and cameras seem to be in hold mode right now – not near the explosion of capabilities seen in previous years.

Pamela Keller, Professor of Art at Athens State University, was our November judge for "Open." However, she could not make the

actual meeting, so Diana Davidson judged the print competition. Diana explained that she would be looking for the image's impact, composition, and technical merit, and she did a great job in selecting the winning images and providing meaningful comments. Congratulations to all of our November winners. Be sure to check them out in the newsletter or in our website gallery.

At the November competition meeting we completed two business items. First, the membership approved the Board-submitted budget for 2015. This budget incorporates a dues increase for family memberships, from \$20 per year, which was the same as for individuals, to \$30 per year, with no limit to number of family members. We also confirmed Charles Gattis as the new Primary Competition Officer, replacing Ernie High.

The Huntsville Museum of Art submissions are due by midnight, December 1st. Each member is allowed 2 submissions. Cara Fuller will down-select the submissions to 70, and then the Museum will choose the final 50 for exhibition. Exhibitors will be notified in early January, which will allow them time to get the images printed and matted. The exhibit starts in early March.

I want to extend my thanks to Henry Norton, one of our newer members, for presenting a miniclass on packing for a photo trip. Henry is a photographer at Redstone Arsenal and has had to pack for many and varied photo trips throughout his career. His insights and suggestions were very valuable, even for day trips, let alone multiple-day trips out of the country.

Don't forget about our Year-End Banquet and awards presentation on December 8th in the Library auditorium. Carrabba's will be catering again and Costco will provide desserts. The banquet starts at 6:00, followed by the awards at 7:00.

New Competition Category

The HPS Board has approved a new competition category for 2015 and beyond - Digital Monochrome. That means we will now have four competition categories - digital color, digital monochrome, color prints, and monochrome prints. The rules for the digital monochrome will be a combination of the digital and monochrome print rules – jpeg format; maximum width = 1920 pixels; maximum height = 1080 pixels; monochrome can be black and white, sepia, or any other single color along with white. The number of submissions will remain the same - four (4)images total, no more than two (2) in any of the four categories.

Charles Gattis, the HPS coordinator for The Arts Council Gallery, needs Fellows or Masters to display in 2015. The immediate concern is for the month of March. This will be a one month display, instead of the usual 2 month, due to Panoply using the Gallery in April.





One such author is **Peter Essick**, a photojournalist for National Geographic magazine. His latest book, Our Beautiful, Fragile World: The Nature and Environmental Photographs of Peter Essick, includes a diverse series of photographs from some of the most beautiful natural areas in the world, including commentary about major environmental issues and the research he completed for each story.
