In September the winners and all the sequences that were chosen to be shown nationally will be presented to the HPS as a program. If you have missed this presentation in the past you need to make every effort to see it this time around, it will be great.

#### Congratulations

HPS's own, Patricia Engle Cole, was chosen to exhibit in 1998 The Red Clay Survey, the Sixth Biennial Exhibition of Contemporary Southern Art, He piece entitled "Waterfall Night" can be seen along with all the other entries at The Huntsville Museum of Art. 63 artists and 100 works were chosen for the exhibit from more than 1500 entries.
