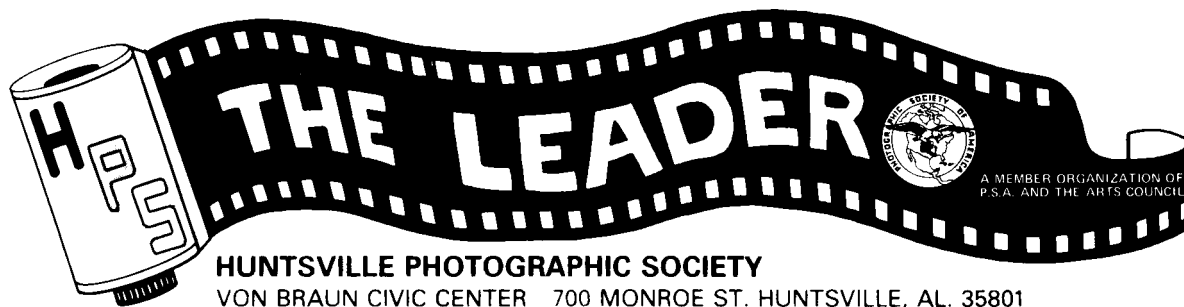
July Competition

The regular consumer version, Elite Chrome 100 X (EBX) seemed to produce much the same results and is a few dollars cheaper. In our point and shoot we used Elite Chrome 200 and were quite pleased with the colors. It seemed to benefit from a bit of underexposure.

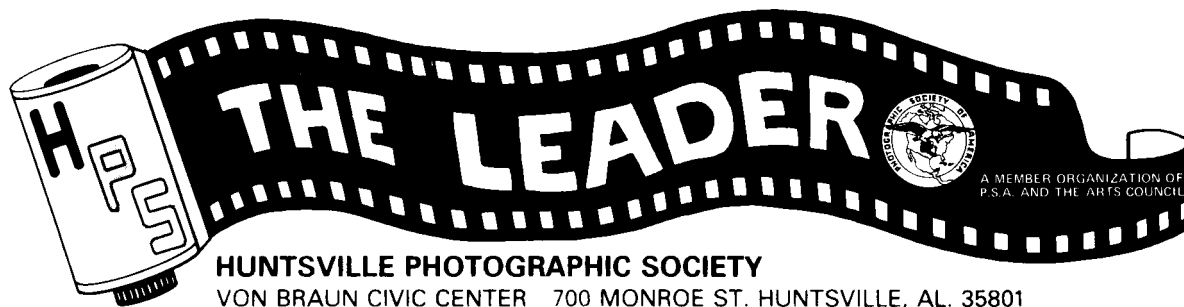
