Lee Pratt, a longtime HPS member and coordinator for the International Stereo Photography Contest Division of the Photographic Society of America for several years, has compiled a slide show of the winners of this years division complete with music and narration. The 36th Annual PSA Stereo Sequence Exhibition will be shown, which consists of 12 short sequences by photographers from several countries. After the HPS showing, it will tour other US photo clubs for a year. A second 3-D program, entitled "Hello from Huntsville, Alabama!" will also be shown. The September competition topic is "Open". Our judge will be Bobby Harrison, Art Program Director and Photography Professor at Oakwood College.


#### In Memorium


