# **November Program Topic**

Barry Jackson, a professional photographer and current lead in the Southerlands Top Five contest, will give "A Talk and Demonstration on Improving Color and Black and White Photographs by Retouching" Different techniques such as improving color, eliminating distracting elements, improving sharpness, and toning down highlights, will be explained with examples. Any person wanting to try some of these techniques will need to bring a 6-0 small brush, a small plastic artist's palette, and a spare color or black and white print. The club will have colors available. Barry's notes on brushes say " On the side of my favorite brush is written, "6/0 LOEW—CORNELL Series M ". Brushes go in size down to a 1 and then start with zeros. A 6/0 is actually a"000000". A 10/0 is really small. The palettes I use were 99 cents each. They have eight small areas and two larger mixing areas. I found two smaller ones were easier to handle than one large one."



-Annual Awards and Party--On Mon. Dec. 13 HPS will hold its Annual Awards Dinner and Party. Dinner will consist of barbecue with all of the trimmings. Dinner will start at 6:00, Awards at approximately 7:00. Tickets are \$6.00 and can be bought at either of the Nov. meetings or by calling Barbara Staggs. This is a great opportunity to view all of the slides and prints that have won in monthly competition in 1999. Best of the Year winners will be announced as well as the Presidents Award for the person who has accumulated the most points during the year. Certificates will also be given for members who have attained Fellows of HPS, Bronze, Silver or Gold Star level and Master of Photography.

-Important News for Monthly Competition Winners--Year-End Photos--If you have been a winner (any place from First to Honorable Mention) in the monthly competitions for 1999 you are eligible to participate in the end of the year competition of Best of the Year Awards. These awards will be given in three divisions: color prints, black and white and color slides. All entries must be turned in to Judy Fleming, Competition Secretary, by the last competition meeting which is Mon. Nov. 22. The entries will then be delivered to the judges. The winners will be presented at the Annual Awards Dinner and Party Mon. Dec. 13.

-Big Bargain--From now until Dec. 31 you can pay your dues for next year for just \$18. In the year 2000 we go back to \$20 a year.


-Possible Change in Determining Competition Points--Your HPS Board has been discussing ways to make the competition process more of a learning experience for all participants. The Board proposes the following to be voted on at the Nov. 22 meeting: The judge will award points to each picture on its own merit. There will be three levels—Gold (3 points). Silver (2 points), and Bronze (1 point). For the Gold level the judge will choose ALL of the pictures that (s)he feels are outstanding, of superior quality. The Silver level would be in the "almost but not guite" but definitely above average category and the Bronze would be at the level of Honorable Mention. There can be more than one award at each level but there may be some that would not receive any points. With the numbers of excellent entries we have been experiencing we feel that this would be a fairer way to give feedback and recognition. All of these awards would be eligible for the End of Year Competition. -As a separate vote the Board proposes that the number of entries be limited to 4. These four could be entered into any category or split between them. -This new system would take effect starting in Jan. 2000.


