PHOTOGRAPHIC CONTEST AND EXHIBITION SPONSORED BY SOUTHERLAND'S PHOTO AND QUALITY PHOTO SERVICES

Photographers are invited to submit photographs taken during the Garden's Flower Festival March 31-April 29, 2001. Prizes will be awarded to adult and youth winners, and selected photographs will be published in The Huntsville Times and displayed at the Garden. Entries may be black and white prints, color prints or 35 mm slides. All entries must be received by the Garden by May 10, 2001. Winners will be announced by May 20, 2001. A FREE Photo Safari will be held at 8 AM on April 7, 2001. Call Melanie Kettle at 430-3572 ext. 290 for a reservation.

Entry Rules:

The competition and exhibition is open to any photographer. There will be two classes: Adults and Youths under 19 years old.

Photographs must be taken at the Huntsville Botanical Garden between 3/31-4/29/01. Black and white prints, color prints and 35mm color slides may be submitted. The photographer's name and telephone number shall be on the back of each print or on color slide mounts. Prints must be unmounted and no larger than 8X12. Each photographer may submit a maximum of 4 photographs.

All entries must be submitted by mail or in person by May 10, 2001 at the Huntsville Botanical Garden, 4747 Bob Wallace Avenue, Huntsville, AL 35805, Attention: Photography Competition. Entries must be accompanied by an entry form. Selected winners and other photographs may be published in The Huntsville Times. Decision of the judges shall be final.

Awards shall be made separately for the adult and youth classes. Cash awards of \$200, \$100 and \$50 will be given respectively for 1^{st} , 2^{ad} , and 3^{rd} place winners in the adult class. Savings Bonds in denominations of \$100, \$75 and \$50 shall be given to the 1^{st} , 2^{ad} , and 3^{rd} place winners in the youth class.

Winners whose pictures are selected for exhibition and possible publication will be notified by June 1, 2001. Entrants may be requested to supply negatives or original transparencies for use in making enlargements if selected for exhibition.

You must include a self-addressed stamped envelope if you want your entries returned by mail after June 1, 2001.

While every effort will be made to return submissions in their original condition, the Huntsville Botanical Garden will not be responsible for the loss of, or damage to, any submitted photographs.
