#### Some Hints Donated to us by Diehl Martin

- --Is your safelight too bright, or too dim? Consider putting a dimmer on it and then use the dimmer to control its output to suit what you are doing, and the illumination level desired. Remember that photo paper can be fogged enough to cause a loss of image contrast, and you might not immediately notice it. Turn the safelight to bright only when you need it, and then turn it down when you don't.
- --What is the chemical in your black and white darkroom which is considered most troublesome when it goes down the drain? It is the silver, which is in solution in your fixer. It is considered a "heavy metal" by the EPA, and has been the cause of various commercial labs being shut down locally. The silver can be removed by use of a "silver recovery unit" which gets the silver out of solution by plating it onto a piece of metal.
