WINTER PHOTOGRAPHY TIPS: By Tom & Pat Cory

This is turning into a winter with snow in many locations that have not seen much of it in the past few years. By dressing warmly you can comfortably get some great images. Wear a hat and warm socks and gloves and take along some chemical hand warmers. Be sure to remember that if the snow is the major element of your composition that with slide film you will need to open up a stop or so to keep the snow from turning gray. The amount depends on your equipment and your taste. It might be a great time to experiment a bit so you will know how to get the exposure you like best with your equipment. And by all means, don't make the mistake of trying to blow something off the end of your lens or you will have some interesting effects.
