"In order to receive the Master status you must meet the following two requirements:

- 1. As a Fellow of HPS, you have won one hundred (100) additional competition points.
- 2. You have a public exhibition with the following stipulations:
 - **a**. The exhibition may be with a group of other exhibitors or a single showing, and the member must display a minimum of six (6) matted or framed prints.
 - **b**. The exhibition must last a minimum of 5 days.
 - c. Time limit:
 - 1. You must inform the Competition Secretary of a showing no later than one year after the point accumulation for Master status, so they may verify it.
 - 2. You must provide the Competition Secretary verifiable evidence of a showing prior to the point accumulation.
 - **d**. It is the member's responsibility to notify the Competition Secretary of the details of the public exhibition, and the HPS Competition Secretary must certify both the points and exhibition requirement. "
