He was always willing to help if he could and acted as judge for the Huntsville Photographic Society many times over the years. Arlon was a member of the Professional Photographers of America and the Tennessee Valley Professional Photographers Association.

He was very generous with his photography knowledge and taught classes for many years and helped local professional photographers achieve their certification from PPA. He even taught a class the night before his death. He always challenged his students to first learn the classic techniques and then enhance with creativity.
