Madison County Heritage Festival

On Sat, Oct 8th, the Madison county Heritage Festival will take place at the Hays Nature Preserve along the Flint River. This is part of Huntsville's Bicentennial celebration. The festival is from 10am - 4pm and is free. There will be storytelling, music, dancing, vendors and exhibitors. Native Americans from the Cherokee and Chickasaw tribes will be performing a play enacting the Trail of Tears. There will be hands-on activities for children (and young-hearted adults) organized by the Burritt Museum and Constitution Hall historians.

On Sun, Oct 9th, there will be field trips to local historical sites: Blouchard's Ford mill, cemeteries, the old Cobb Bridge, and some historical homes will be featured on the field tours. There is a limit of 30 people for the tour and a cost of \$5 per person.
