Review: Pentax K10D...submitted by Andrea Shetley

Three HPS members now have the 10MP Pentax K10D. This camera compares well with the other four 10MP sub-\$1000 bodies pictured on February's Pop Photo cover.

Some of the biggest "upgrades" from previous models include:

Internal shake-reduction via a CCD that can shift vertically, horizontally, or rotationally to counteract hand shake. This will work with any Pentax lens made in the last 30 years. The sensor can also vibrate on startup to dislodge dust.

To further combat dust, the camera has "the best-sealed DSLR body in the sub \$1000 class," according to Pop Photo.

Capture in RAW + JPG, with Adobe's DNG format as an option. 22-bit A/D converter.

Burst 3-frame-per-second shooting of highest-quality JPG's is only limited by the memory card.

Glass pentaprism, user-changeable focusing screens, and much greater use of buttons over menu options, including autofocus, and RAW toggle switches.

2.5 inch LCD, 11-point autofocus, and Li-ion rechargeable batteries, rated at 730 shots/charge.

Pop Photo's summary is: "Pentax's reputation as the lightweight among DSLR makers is officially obliterated..."

While visiting the website of Washington, DC's National Museum of Women in the Arts, I discovered they are seeking women artist to add to their online archived database.

"If an artist has had one solo exhibition in a museum or gallery, she may be qualified to be included in the Archives on Women Artists in the NMWA Library and Research Center. The Archives consists of vertical files with information on thousands of women artists from all time periods and nationalities and is used by historians, gallery owners, artists, students, and museum staff."

The database is used to increase visibility, reputation, and public awareness of women in the arts. Clara: Database of

Women Artists[™] is scheduled to be launched sometime in February/March 2007. The database will be accessible free of charge via NMWA's website at www.nmwa.org
