FROM THE PRESIDENT:

Happy (Almost) Spring!

Well, it's getting to be that time of year again...warm weather, glorious colors everywhere, and plenty of photo ops. We're nearly there! We've had a taste of spring to keep us on our toes. Are you ready to get out and photograph?

This time of year, waterfalls are a great place to visit. Water should be flowing from winter thaw and spring rains. Be sure to use your tripod for long exposures to blur the water creating the "cotton candy" or "angel hair" look.

Also, flowers are starting to bloom everywhere (some came up in February!). Look carefully as you are wandering the trails and fields-some are very tiny; but extremely beautiful when you get up close. This is an excellent time to try your hand at close-up or macro photography. A simple, inexpensive set of diopters is all you need to get started. Although these attachments are not of the best quality, they will let you see if you want to continue with close-up work before investing in more expensive (but better quality) equipment. Diopters are clear magnifying filters that attach to the front of your lens that reduce the minimum focusing distance of your primary lens allowing you to move closer to the subject, which enlarges it on the film or sensor. There is no light loss, so no exposure compensation is needed. However, there is more glass to collect dust and fingerprints, so be sure to keep your equipment clean. Tubes are another affordable way to get into macro work. They go between the camera body and the lens and also reduce the minimum focusing distance of the primary lens, and they have no glass to get dirty. But because they extend the length of the lens there is some light loss, which requires exposure compensation.

We had an excellent turnout for our February program. Stan Prevost showed us the basics of ProShow Gold, an excellent, inexpensive software program used to create digital slide shows. At \$69.95 (download only; \$79.95 for download, CD, and manual), it is well worth every penny. This program is pretty much industry standard among professional photographers now. Do not have Velcro tabs or other mounting material on the back of your prints as they will be stacked and can damage other prints. Make sure there is no sticky adhesive on the back or around the edges that could damage other prints.

It was great to see several of our members have their images published or do well in other competitions. Please send any achievement to our newsletter editor, Rick Kress, for publication. We love to see what our members are doing, and congratulate and encourage them in their efforts. Don't be shy!

News From HPS Activities VP, Robert Schuffert.

The Birmingham Zoo is located at 2630 Cahaba Road near Homewood. The phone number is 1 205 879-0409. Take I-65 south toI-59N / I-20E toward Gadsden. Just past the downtown Birmingham buildings(about 1 mile) take US280E / US31S. Go past St. Vincent's Hospital, and over the mountain. Get in the right-hand lane to follow US280E. Here you should be able to follow the Zoo signs or follow the attached map.

Birmingham Zoo is home to birds, reptiles and mammals over 750 animals from around the world. There are numerous endangered species from six continents. The botanical exhibit features hundreds of butterflies from more than 20 species - all are native to Alabama. Within the Birmingham Zoo is the Hugh Kaul Children's Zoo, dedicated to children and urban/rural animals of Alabama.

If you plan to go down early to photograph the Zoo animals (I believe the entry fee is \$11.00), be aware the Zoo closes at 5:00pm. Tom Ulrich will judge the Shades Valley Camera Club's photo competition starting at 6:30pm (we are invited) and begin his presentation at 7pm, all in the Zoo Auditorium, which is accessible from the parking lot outside the Zoo (no charge). His presentation should be over by around 8:30 and the Shades Valley Camera Club has invited to go have dinner with them, usually at Jim & Nick's BBQ. Passing of former member

HPS sends it's sincere condolences to the family of Wesley Swift, Sr. Mr. Swift, who passed away March 1, 2007, was a friend and former member of HPS. A Michigan native, he started a photography club in high school. After World War II, he opened a photography studio in Winchester, Tennessee, and reported for the Associated Press. He and his family moved to Huntsville in 1955 and he worked in the Army photo lab. He retired from the Army as a lieutenant colonel and retired from civil service in 1981. Due to health reasons he wasn't able to attend HPS meetings in recent years. His son Wesley Jr. is a former HPS vice-president.

Jose Betancourt

Born in Havana, Cuba. Grew up in Florida. Later moved to New York City. Jose studied at Hunter College with Rov DeCarava, Mark Feldstein, Juan Sanchez, and Robert Morris. He served as a grant panelist for the New York City Department of Cultural Affairs and is a recipient of the Nisod Award for teaching excellence from the University of Texas at Austin. While in New York he taught at Hunter College, Asphalt Green, The Calhoun School, and The Cooper Union for the Advancement of Science and Art. He and his wife moved from New York City almost two years ago. Last school year he taught at Watkins College of Art and Design in Nashville, Alabama A&M University and Motlow State Community College in Lynchburg, Tennessee. They live, with their dog, Addie, in the foothills of the Cumberland Plateau close to Sewanee, Tennessee where his wife teaches first grade at Sewanee Elementary.

The Rev. Dr. Robert Hurst, Pastor

Bob grew up in Omaha, Nebraska. He graduated from Trinity College, Hartford, Connecticut in 1971 and earned an M.Div.degree from Yale Divinity School in New Haven, Connecticut in 1975. Fresh out of seminary he served as Associate Pastor at Salem UCC in Allentown, Pennsylvania. In 1977 he became the pastor of East Main Congregational UCC in Galesburg, Illinois. While at East Main, he began working toward a D.Min.degree at the Chicago Theological Seminary, focusing on pastoral counseling, and completed the program in 1981. While in the program he developed and led a series of divorce adjustment groups. Afterward he wrote his doctoral dissertation on spiritual development during the divorce adjustment/recovery process. Bob also taught business ethics and the history of philosophy at the college level as an adjunct faculty member.

Bob has traveled extensively. Some of his trips include China, Israel----etc-- -Bob is a participant in a three-year, Huntsville-based small clergy group, the Institute for Clergy Excellence (ICE), funded by the Lily Endowment. This interfaith group is focused on both preaching excellence and worship experience enrichment. As part of his ICE involvement, he will lead a group from United Church on a visit to Israel in October of 2007.

Bob came to Alabama in 2001. He is married to Beth Harland Hurst.
