everything else in your viewfinder. ELIMINATE everything that's not necessary to enhance your idea. There are several ways to emphasize your center of interest:

a. Rule of Thirds

Decide on your main subject and place it at one of the intersections of a tic tac toe pattern. This is a general rule and gets the subject off center. When shooting portraits of animals or people, consider the eyes as the main subject, and keep them out of the center of the picture. The eyes should be the sharpest element. Don't place the horizon in the middle unless it's a reflection.

b. Simple Backgrounds

1. If you are shooting one main subject such as a flower or a person, and the background is not important or doesn't add to the subject, simplify it. Move yourself or your subject to have a less distracting background. Watch for distracting lines or colors brighter than the subject. Eliminate distracting elements such as stray tree branches. The farther away the subject is from the background the more the background will blur to reduce distracting elements. You can use your zoom or macro on your subject. It will produce a more blurred background.

2. If you have an SLR or an advanced point and shoot you can use a large aperture, e.g. *f*/2.8, *f*/4 or *f*/5.6 or the largest available (but smallest number) to eliminate or blur distracting elements in the background. You will get less of a blurred background using basic digital point and shoot cameras. Try using the portrait mode. Usually a flash will darken and simplify the elements in the background.

C. Use color

Strong or contrasting color makes the subject stand out. Your subject should usually be the brightest spot or most colorful in the frame. Look around the edges and eliminate bright or light spots.

Other hints for better composition.

Move in close to fill your viewfinder with the subject. Many times verticals work best for pictures of people or any other subject that is taller than wider. Choose the best viewpoint for your pictures. Move up, down, in, out, to eliminate everything that doesn't add to the picture. Use an unusual camera angle. Take 5 or 6 shots of the same subject varying your angle. Give people, animals or moving objects room to move in the frame. They should be looking into it rather than out. Shoot up to make your subject look larger, down to make it smaller.

Line: one of the strongest elements in design.

Putting your subject on the diagonal will breathe life into an otherwise static composition. S curves and diagonals can lead your eye through the picture. Allow a leading line to come up from the bottom of the frame to draw the eye into the photo and to the center of interest, preferably from left bottom, but usually not the exact corner.


