March Program-Focus on Sharpness



Stan Prevost is a 38-year resident of Huntsville. He was an active member and officer of HPS in the 1970s, renewing his involvement a few years ago after a period of inactivity. Currently Stan's photographic objectives are purely personal, oriented toward learning, teaching, and sharing with friends and family. In the past, he did weddings and portraits on a part-time basis with a local studio. He loved production of monochrome prints in his

own darkroom. Stan's current interests include panoramic photography and High Dynamic Range Imaging and related techniques, while continuing to pursue his life-long quest for understanding and mastery of the fundamentals.

His program in 2008, was "Focus on Exposure", which was concerned with exposure as an element of image quality. It explored the nature of light and how to use our equipment to properly exploit the light to create a high-quality image. Following the theme of image quality, the March program is called "Focus on Sharpness". It explores the subject of sharpness as a major element of image quality. It will identify many of the contributing elements of sharpness in the various phases of the

children. No nudity or graphic content.

- Art must either be framed (wood, composite, or metal frames) or otherwise capable of having hanging attachments affixed (gallery framing).
- For the safety of the public, no glass may be used as a protective covering. Plexiglas or similar covering only.
- No single item over 60 pounds.
- For display purposes, no art smaller than 16" x 20" (framed size).

The upper size limit will be determined by HPS, but we must keep in mind that the wider the frame the fewer number of frames will be available to hang in the space allowed.

An 8" x 10" framed Artist Bio for each artist's display will be required.

We will be responsible for all hanging, changing, and removal of art work as well as the Artist's Bio's.

Huntsville Madison County Library (Main Branch)

The Huntsville Madison County Public Library is looking for 15 to 20 framed photographs of either Huntsville, Madison County, or Alabama to be displayed in The Jane Lowe Gallery located on the third floor of the main library. The photographs must be themed, for instance "The bridges of Madison County" but not necessarily historic. However, I think it would be good to relate it to historical Huntsville pictures if possible - since the State of Alabama has declared 2009 the "Year of History".

The photographs will be needed for some time after April, and will be displayed for about a month. Framed size restrictions for the photographs are 8" x 10" minimum and 16" x 20" maximum. The artist's name will be displayed, and possibly the sales price. The library will have final say and selection of which photographs it will display.

More Info About ProShow Gold From Tom Bryant

Please see Tom's web page at: http://home.hiwaay.net/~ctbryant/ for the PowerPoint slides that supported the presentation and a travel slide show. A free trial version of Proshow Gold 4.0 can be downloaded from Photodex.com. Tom will bring some CDs to the next meeting with the version he is running and the shows that he used for demonstration during the talk. I also put up a document Andrea Shetley uses for her "Creating Digital Slide Shows" presentation that outlines the new features of ProShow Gold 4.0 and the differences between Gold and Producer.

Tips on Sound Track: ProShow likes to add sound track from CD, probably because of copyright concerns. Unlike narration, which is attached to individual slides, Sound Track is not. It

is most convenient to arrange images first and set slide duration and then add sound tracks. Then individual slide duration can be automatically fine-tuned to match the Sound Track by selecting the proper buttons from Manage Sound Tracks. Details follow:

- From pull-down menus, go to Audio/Save music from CD. I suggest you change the default title from Track # to something more descriptive. After capturing music, go to Audio/Manage SoundTrack. Here you can arrange the tracks in proper order. Then click on desired track and click "Edit Fades and Timing". Here you can set desired duration of sound and fades.
- 2) To add Sound Track from a music file such as .mp3, go to Timeline view by pressing Tab key. Bring up My Music folder or wherever it is stored, and drag file onto track below slides. You can hold CTRL down and set sound fades manually here.

Fiery Gizzard Field Trip Tracy City, TN

Saturday, March 14th, HPS will sponsor a hike along the Grundy Forest Day Loop Trail adjacent Tracy City, Tennessee. This well-worn two mile loop trail is mostly easy and follows beside the Little Fiery Gizzard and the Big Fiery Gizzard Creeks for about two thirds of its length. Two waterfalls, Blue Hole Falls and Hanes Hole Falls, both 10 feet high, and many small cascades flow



under large hemlocks and cliffs. At the 0.7 mile point along the loop trail, a bridge crosses Little Fiery Gizzard Creek, where the

main Fiery Gizzard Trail continues another 12 miles southeast to the 50 foot Foster Falls. It's easier to drive to Foster Falls! About 0.6 miles along this trail, you'll reach the 12 foot Sycamore Falls. Here, the group will turn back, but there are many other water features and overlooks along this strenuous 12 mile trail.

Tracy City is located northwest of Chattanooga and just east of Monteagle. The Fiery Giz-

zard area is managed by South Cumberland State Park, with the Visitor's Center halfway between Tracy City and Monteagle on the north side of US41A. The State Park manages 10 separate areas on the Cumberland Plateau, including Foster Falls, Savage Gulf, Stone Door and Greeter Falls, in this beautiful region of Middle Tennessee. The Fiery Gizzard area is south of US41A on the western edge of Tracy City behind an elementary school. Once in the parking area, there are two trails leading into the forest. Both are the loop trail, but the best way in is by the south trail at the trailhead sign (not the trail behind the restrooms, this is the return trail).

The map shows the main route to reach Tracy City. This route follows Winchester Road to Huntland, US64 to Winchester, Sewanee and Monteagle. The other route follows US72 east through Scottsboro, South Pittsburg and Jasper. The route through Winchester is significantly shorter at around 90 miles, but the other route passes right by Foster Falls and has better highways.

We can meet at the Huntsville Library at 9:00 am and drive or carpool from there. Everyone needs to sign the HPS release form before departure. For more info contact Robert at (256) 881-1354 or e-mail reschuff@knology.net.
