May Program- Create Crud Photo Shootout



The May 11th program will be presented by HPS member Barbara Staggs. She will present the 2009 Creative Crud Photo Shootout. A slide show will display all of the entries along with the winners. In addition, there will be a chance to vote on "The People's Choice".

In Feb/Mar timeframe, twenty-four participants paid a dollar for an object purchased at a Dollar Tree store.

They could submit up to four pictures of the object, including one straight up photo so the judge could tell what the object was. The other three entries were up to the creativity of the artist. The creativity must take place in the camera, with only basic software correction, such as cropping, allowed. Entries were judged based on creativity and composition.



"Through The Lens of Adam Jones" Samford University Planetarium Birmingham, May 22, 7:00 p.m.


Adam Jones is an internationally recognized photographer specializing in travel, nature, and wildlife who explores the world creating his distinctive images. Jones's award-winning photography is widely published in magazines, posters, calendars, books, and in national advertising campaigns for clients such as Canon, Ford, Eddie Bauer, Miller Beer and Honda.

Adam Jones is recognized worldwide as an outstanding stock photographer with his photographs represented around the world by Getty Images, Corbis, Tony Stone, Visuals Unlimited, Photo Researchers, Oxford Scientific, and Danita Delimont Stock Photography. His work has sold for editorial and commercial uses in over 30 countries. Adam is noted for beautiful graphic nature images and clean distinctive travel images.

Adam's publication credits also include: National Geographic Books, Time, Life Magazine, National Wildlife Federation, Audubon, Sierra Club, Disney, People Magazine, Hallmark Cards, and hundreds of textbooks. In 1995 the BBC Wildlife Photographer of the Year Contest honored Adam by selecting one of his images from over 19, 000 entries, as the winner in the "In Praise of Plants" category. Adam has published seven coffee-table books, with three released in 2004. These include his popular instructional book: The Step-by-Step Photography Workshop, which he also authored, The Great Smoky Mountains Natural Wonder National Park, and Great Smoky Mountains Simply Beautiful. Adam's latest book published by Farcountry Press is entitled "Kentucky Simply Beautiful."

In early 2006, Adam was selected to be one of Canon USA's elite group of photographers, The Explorers of Light. Canon describes the Explorer of Light program as such: The Explorers of Light program is a group of 60 of the World's best photographers united in their love and passion for photographic excellence. They share a common desire to contribute back to the industry with a willingness to share their vision and passion with others.

Adam is a popular and respected workshop instructor and lecturer. Adam teaches photography workshops around the world helping students reach their full potential in the exciting world of digital photography. He has taught for Canon, Popular Photography & Imaging, Maine Photographic Workshops, Rocky Mountain School of Photography, Great American Photography Workshops and Joe Van Os Photo Safaris. Adam is noted for his enthusiastic down to earth approach and his ability to communicate effectively with all skill levels.


