January Program-Photo Potpourri

The January 11th program will be a repeat of last year's popular "Photo Potpourri". Many people commented on how much they enjoyed this program and asked that it be repeated in 2010. As last year, this program will offer opportunities for all level of photographers to contribute their work. Novices are encouraged to bring some of their photos for discussion and ask any questions that they have about the photographs - how and if it could be, or should be, improved for competition. Club members can offer advice on composition, cropping, lighting, etc. I have found this type of feedback very valuable in helping me learn how to submit photos for competition that I hope will stand out from the rest and catch the judge's attention.

Masters and advanced photographers are asked to

bring some of their best, their most interesting, or whatever photos they wish to share with the club members. They can tell how and where they took the photo, if any particular technique or gear was used, either in taking the shot, or photo editing it with software.

For those of us who fall somewhere between novice and master, please feel free to submit any photos that you wish to discuss or offer for group discussion and feedback.

The quidelines and details of submission are:

- You may submit up to 6 photographs.

DIY Diffuser For Hot –Shoe Flash

The article discusses the importance of the light source and it's distance to the object being photographed. Both elements play an important role in softening shadows and creating the intended mood of an image.

The author discusses the pros and cons of bouncing light off of ceilings,

and the preferred method of bouncing the light off a surface attached to a hot shoe mounted flash unit. Directions on how to create the diffuser, including templates with dimensions and where to obtain materials, are provided.




