

Morocco Photo Trip by Joy Henderson

Diana Davidson and I were on a trip from Sept 12 to Sept 28 and traveled over a large area in Morocco including Casablanca, Fez, Marakech, Essouraia and the Sahara. We went on a photo tour with Tom and Pat Cory.

We found that Morocco is the land of "don't take my picture". This did limit people photos to those we could sneak or those where we paid the person we were photographing. The ruins of

Kasbahs, forts and other structures were good subjects. In Essouria most of the small fishing boats are painted bright blue making for interesting pictures. One fort we went into had been converted into housing and all the buildings were painted blue and white. Some of the riads where we stayed were restored and beautifully decorated. A mosque, tile and pottery factory, leather tanning facility and wonderful shops were on the itiner-

ary. We visited very old medinas and souks with narrow passages where you had to squeeze to the wall to let donkeys laden with goods go by. In Marakech at Djemaa el Fna Square there was a carnival atmosphere with fortune tellers, snake charmers, henna women who practice their art on hands and feet and many food vendors. Hot mint tea is the drink of the country and both of us now have a teapot from Morocco.
