May Program - Photo Potpourri

The January 10th program will be a repeat of last year's popular "Photo Potpourri". Many people commented on how much they enjoyed this program and asked that it be repeated again. As in the past, this program will offer opportunities for all level of photographers to contribute their work.

Novices are encouraged to bring some of their photos for discussion and ask any questions that they have about the photographs - how and if it could be, or should be, improved for competition. Club members can offer advice on composition, cropping, lighting, etc. I have found this type of feedback very valuable in helping me learn how to submit photos for competition that I hope will stand out from the rest and catch the judge's attention.

Masters and advanced photographers are asked to bring some of their best, their most interesting, or whatever photos they wish to share with the club members. They can tell how and where they took the photo, if any particular technique or gear was used, either in taking the shot, or photo editing it with software.

For those of us who fall somewhere between novice and master, please feel free to submit any photos that you wish to discuss or offer for group discussion and feedback.

The guidelines and details of submission are:

- You may submit up to 6 photographs.
- Deadline is Friday, May 6th.
- Submit digitally at <u>HPSContest@knology.net</u>, but make the subject line Potpourri instead of HPS Contest.

File name format is FullName-01.jpg, FullName-02.jpg, ...

8th Annual National Natural Landmarks **Photo Contest**

The National Park Service is pleased to announce the 8th Annual National Natural Landmarks Photo Contest. We are seeking images highlighting the significant natural resources of the nearly 600 designated Natural Landmarks nationwide. The top 13 winning photographs will appear in the 2012 National Natural Landmarks calendar, which will be a commemorative edition in honor of the NNL Program's 50th Anniversary (1962-2012).

Each entrant may submit up to three photographs to the contest, but each photograph must be from a different NNL site. Please note: images of the 13 NNL sites featured in large format in the 2011 calendar will not be accepted. These images can be found at

http://www.nature.nps.gov/nnl/cur rentwinners.cfm. Entries are accepted in digital, print, and slide formats. All entries must be emailed or post-marked no later than June 30, 2011. Winners will be announced in September.

National Natural Landmark sites are not units of the National Park System. While a few do occur within national park units, most sites are located within state, county or city parks, wildlife refuges, national forests, and tribal or private lands. The National Natural Landmarks Program recognizes and encourages the conservation of outstanding examples of our country's natural history. It is the only natural areas program of national scope that identifies and honors the best examples of biological and geological features in both public and private ownership. The National Park Service partners with and supports landmark owners and managers in their conservation efforts.


