# In Focus

### August Program- Photo Tours by Bill Snoddy

This month's program is on photo touring, what it is, and is it something you might wish to consider. Basically, photo touring is simply a tour where the focus is totally on photography. Normally lead by a photographically savvy leader, whose job is to get you to



the right places, at the right times, and give advice as desired. Our speaker, Bill Snoddy, has been on several photo tours and will share with us his experiences, and some things to consider in case you are tempted to try one. As an example, he will focus on a ten day tour through England with mentions of other photo tours to the U.S. Southwest. During the England tour the nine person group made 110 photo stops. Some as short as 15 minutes others for several hours. Traveling in a customized van allowed access to many areas unavailable to traditional tour groups. An unexpected bonus was the comradery of traveling 24/7 with a group of dedicated photographers, all sharing the goal of getting good images.

Bill has been involved with photography since high school where he was the school newspaper photographer. After arriving in Huntsville in 1958, he join the newly forming HPS and has been an "off and on" member throughout the years. Currently his focus is on travel and family photography. He especially enjoys creating photo books using the new capabilities of on-line photo book printing (a subject he presented in a program a couple of years ago).

# August Mini Class – Lighting and Photographing People Outdoors

Sam Tumminello, HPS Master, will present the August mini class on Aug 22, at 6:00 p.m. before the monthly club competition meeting. He enjoys photographing people outdoors and will offer ideas on lighting techniques, natural backgrounds, and his exposure techniques. He was a film user for years and printed his own black and white prints in his darkroom. He will share his techniques to explore those elements of natural lighting for pleasing results.

Now using digital equipment, he

attempts to use many of the same techniques he used with film and prints. He says: "Like all digital photographers - we are all at various levels of expertise. The trick is to keep learning, keep up with the everevolving equipment and image editing applications and continue to use the ease of digital trial and error."

Preparation prior to the shoot.

- An easy tool to enhance the appearance of the subject.
