







Rod Planck Photography Workshops

Blue Sky and Red Rock, Apr 29-May 8.

Capitol Reef National Park, Dixie National Forest and Grand Staircase/Escalante National Monument, Utah. The slickrock country of southeastern Utah contains some of the wildest areas remaining in the lower 48 states. Landscapes and close-up subjects in this fascinating land are the focus of this tour. This is an exciting land of buttes, arches, mesas, deep canyons, and vast desert vistas. We'll examine the subtle striations of Navajo sandstone and the brighter red hues of Wingate sandstone. The low sunlight of morning and evening saturates the spectacular slickrock formations, intensifying the multiple shades of beige, orange and red.

<u>Summer Safaris – Bugs and Blooms, June 10 – 15.</u>

Tahquamenon Watershed, Niagara Escarpment and Seney National Wildlife Refuge Newberry, Michigan. Six-Participant Workshop for Advanced Photographers. Learn the lost art of photographing wild insects in the field! If you have ever wondered if it was possible to photograph insects without manipulation, then this workshop is for you. We'll explore the use of natural light and flash (Fill light and Full TTL) to photograph insects and other small creatures like spiders, reptiles, and amphibians without using physical manipulation.

Foggy Bogs and Dewy Insects, Aug 19 – 24.

Tahquamenon Watershed and Seney National Wildlife Refuge Upper Peninsula - Michigan Standard Workshop (Excellent For Beginning and Intermediate Skill Levels). We have dramatically lowered the fee for this workshop to make it easier for entry level photographers to attend. We know that once you have taken a workshop from Rod you'll be hooked on nature photography for life. Early morning fog cloaks the black spruce and tamarack bogs of this region, creating an otherworldly landscape. Emerging and receding tree silhouettes are cast upon an ever-changing canvas as intensifying sunlight gradually changes the morning sky from pale orange to magenta. As the morning sun's first rays reach into grassy meadows surrounding small woodland lakes, dew-bejeweled plants and insects are rendered in breathtaking beauty. If the weather is right, we may find dozens, even hundreds, of dew-covered dragonflies, as well as other insects, and a variety of spider webs to photograph.

South Dakota Badlands and Black Hills, Sep 3-10.

Badlands National Park, Wind Cave National Park, Buffalo Gap National Grasslands and Custer State Park For Intermediate and Advanced Photographers. Rod has spent countless hours over his career exploring the fascinating wild country of South Dakota's Badlands and Black Hills. Join our South Dakota Badlands and Black Hills Tour and take advantage of Rod's vast knowledge of nature photography and extensive experience
