In Focus

November Program- Intro To Infrared with Chris Baker

Infrared (IR) photography is a wonderful way to breathe new life into common landscape scenes. The light spectrum is broken up into wavelengths where visible light that we are accustom to capturing on our cameras occupies the 380-750nm range. Just below this range is ultraviolet (UV) light (100-400nm) and above is IR (700-1200nm) light, which are both invisible to the naked eye. IR light has unique qualities that, when isolated, produce interesting visual effects. Foliage and

vegetation reflect IR light and, thus, have a distinct bright/near-white appearance. Conversely, water and sky absorb IR light and appear very dark. When applied to portraits, skin appears light-colored and smooth with blemishes and freckles disappearing. However, veins are enhanced giving skin a very translucent and "goolish" look.



Contrary to popular belief, a specially modified digital camera is not necessary to get started in IR photography. Anyone can experiment using a simple IR filter attached to the end of a lens, which is how Chris's journey began six months ago. Since then, he's learned a great deal about filters, camera bodies, lenses, and post-processing and will present his lessons learned to help those interested get their start in this fascinating genre.

Chris's photography habit started over 10 years ago with a basic Panasonic point and shoot camera. He quickly outgrew the limitations of the point and shoot and is now fully invested with Nikon mirrorless and DSLR camera bodies and lenses. Chris has been a member of HPS since 2018 and enjoys having an active role with the organization as the Digital Competition Chair. Chris loves to teach and share his knowledge with anyone interested in learning.






