




Huntsville Museum of Art Exhibit

One of the great honors given to HPS members is the opportunity to exhibit our work at our local art museum. I know of few camera clubs who have this privilege. It speaks to the quality of the art produced by the members of our society as well as the support given to us by the Huntsville community.

The exhibition is juried by the museum curator and only the best pieces are selected. Each year we have a limit of fifty photographs to display, but I don't think we have ever exhibited that number. Usually around forty-eight images are select, which is to say that the curators are very particular about the art they allow in their galleries and for an HPS member to have one or two of his/her images selected is a great honor. We are thankful to the museum



for giving us this opportunity each year and appreciative also to our members who have presented such quality photographic art in the past.


The schedule for getting everything together for the event is below as previously sent out in a recent email. As I said, the online gallery is already open, and you have until February 20th to upload no more five images for consideration. The reception is on May 19, so go ahead and put that on your calendar as it will be great fun.

- 1. Any active member of HPS can submit up to 5 images for the Huntsville Museum of Art Exhibit if they have an active email address provided to HPS that they read on a regular basis.
- 2. This year's theme is open no topic.
- 3. All entries must adhere to the digital requirements found on the HPS website.
- 4. The portal for submitting images is now open and will close on February 20 at 9:00. The entry page is under Competitions, titled HMA 2022.
- 5. Entries will be judged from February 20-27, and selected exhibitors will be notified.
- 6. Mats will be distributed starting on February 27.
- 7. Matted images must be returned by April 10 to Rick or Tom. HPS will provide the frames as well as the mats, so please use the mats provided. The frames are all 24" x 18", meaning that the largest print size allowed is 22" x 16". All prints should be at least 12" in each direction.
- 8. Images will be framed at the museum during the week of April 17. The museum determines the specific date.
- 9. The exhibit will open on Thursday, May 19, 2022, with a reception from 5:30-7:00 pm.
- 10. The exhibit will run through August 7, 2022




