November Program—How to Enjoy, Observe and Photograph a Total Solar Eclipse


Dr. Gordon Telpun is a board-certified plastic surgeon in private practice in Decatur, AL. He has observed and photographed five total solar eclipses (2001, 2002, 2006, 2017, 2019). To help eclipse photographers be successful, he developed the first eclipse contact time "talking timer" for the 2002 eclipse. The concept was released before the 2017 eclipse as a mobile app for Apple and Android. In April of this year, he released a 513-page e-book that is a comprehensive guide to the total eclipse experience, including extensive tutorials on eclipse photography and videography.

His presentation will briefly discuss the basics of solar eclipse astronomy and then concentrate on the techniques to be successful with eclipse photography. The topics will include gear setup, filters, focal length/image scale, exposure settings, proper timing, focus, and corona imaging. He will demonstrate the techniques in real time using his app's eclipse video practice session.








Annual Meeting By Charles Gattis

Our annual meeting will be held at the beginning of our regular program meeting on November 14, 2022. At that time, we will elect officers for 2023 and vote on the budget for that year. As I said previously, at this time, our income for the society does not sufficiently meet our needs. You may remember that I sent out a survey recently asking for you suggest areas in which we can either find more resources or cut the budget to provide a balanced budget for 2023. The board met recently and tried very hard to use the suggestions from that survey to be able to present to you a



balanced budget for 2023. I thought that I would mention a few of the changes that we foresee as we look at that budget on November 14.

We had two values in mind as we looked at what HPS needed to do going forward:

- 1. We wanted not to be hurried at our meetings, especially competition since we felt that the judge's comments were very important to help individuals grow as photographers. The easiest way to balance the budget was to move back to the library where we had no venue cost, but with the library's new closing time, that would only allow for a little over an hour for our meeting time.
- 2. We also wanted to preserve as much of our tradition as possible, especially that of seeing the prints with the judge and hearing the judge's comments as well as providing a special time at the end of the year for awards and fellowship.

Therefore, here are the major changes in the budget that we are recommending:

- 1. Increase dues to \$30 for individuals, \$45 for families, and \$15 for students.
- 2. Pay only for travel and dinner for judges were these are needed.
- 3. Use Zoom for some programs during the year and have other programs provided by members, perhaps bringing back "Creative Crud," and "Photograph a Tune."
- 4. Have only dessert and drinks at the annual End of Year banquet rather than a meal that we usually had to subsidize to keep cost down.

Of course, during the meeting members will have the opportunity to make other nominations for the board in addition to those provided by the nominating committee. You will also be able to ask questions about the budget and make proposals. I hope you will make every effort to join us on November 14.


